As a graphic designer/writer/producer of print and audio-visual materials for industrial, hospitality and racquet sports marketing for nearly 50 years, Fox now concentrates much of his time with his camera and lenses enjoying scenic and wildlife photography.

His favorite photo "studio" is the beautiful, expansive 40,000 acre Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge, located in the shallow marshlands of Galloway Township just across the bay from Atlantic City, New Jersey.

This coastal habitat is an important link in the network of refuges administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services, and is home to an extraordinary population of ducks, geese, herons, egrets and swans along with deer, foxes and nearly every other variety of winged and fur-bearing creatures to be found in the wilds of northeastern United States. Huge numbers of snowgeese migrate to spend the winter at the refuge, which Fox describes as a year-round "candy store" for bird watchers, photographers, artists and those who just want a peaceful, relaxing experience with Mother Nature.

Fox is currently preparing a photographic essay covering the Forsythe Refuge and adjacent historic areas of Smithville, Chestnut Neck, Oyster Creek and Port Republic.
